# Anti-Histamine Protocol (MCAS)

#### **Protocol Overview**

- The goal is to find most effective combination of H1 and H2 blocking medications
- H1 and H2 blockers are medications that work by:
  - Stabilizing mast cells
  - Improving symptoms & reactivity

## **Dosing the Medications**

- For the 2 week trials, start with 1 tablet of the medicine for the first week.
- If you don't see improvement, take 1 tablet twice per day for another week.
- Stay on the dose you find most effective for improving symptoms.
- Stop any medications that are not effective

### **Identifying the Most Effective Medications**

\*Do not make any medication changes until you speak with your doctor\*

Pick one H1 blocking medication from the below list and stick with it for 2 weeks. If you don't see an improvement in symptoms, move on to a different H1 blocking medication. Continue this process until you find one that you feel is most helpful

- Claritin (Loratadine) 10 mg 1 tablet daily, may increase to 1 tablet twice daily.
- Zyrtec (Cetirizine) 10 mg 1 tablet daily, may increase to 1 tablet twice daily.
- Allegra (Fexofenadine) 60 mg 1 tablet daily, may increase to 1 tablet twice daily.

Once you find an effective H1 blocker, trial different H2 blockers in the same way you tested the H1 blockers

- Pepcid (Famotidine) 20 mg 1 tablet daily, may increase to 1 tablet twice daily.
- Tagamet (Cimetidine) 200 mg 1 tablet daily, may increase to 1 tablet twice daily.
